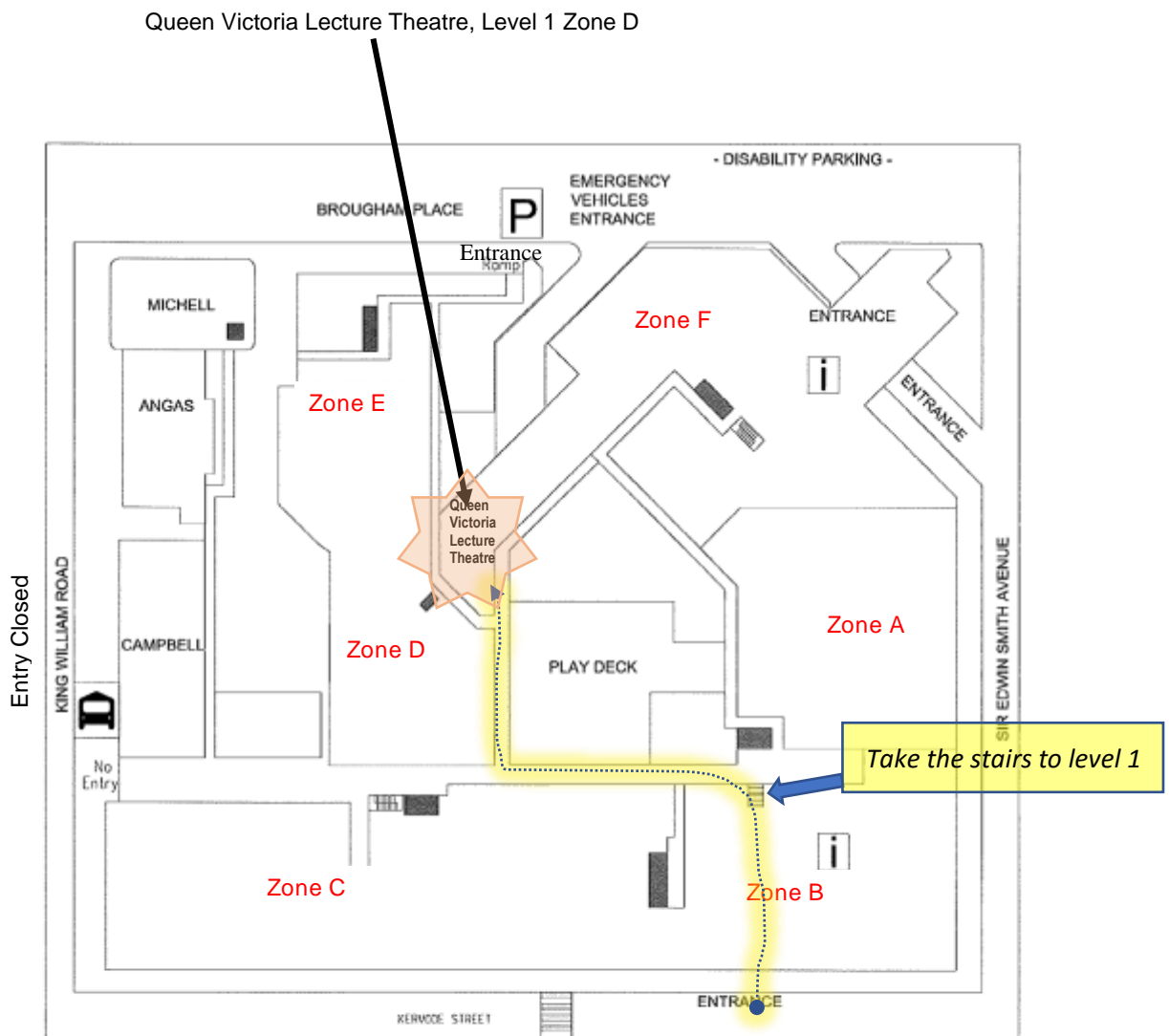

The Queen Victoria Lecture Theatre is the main lecture theatre of the Adelaide Women's and Children's Hospital. Enter off Kermode street, and straight in front you will see stairs. Walk up the stairs to level one and TURN LEFT. Walk along the corridor, past the play café (on the right) and take the FIRST RIGHT. Directly, you will pass the 'Starlight Foundation' on your left and the next left is the Queen Victoria Lecture Theatre. There will be signage with the AADDM conference logo along the route.

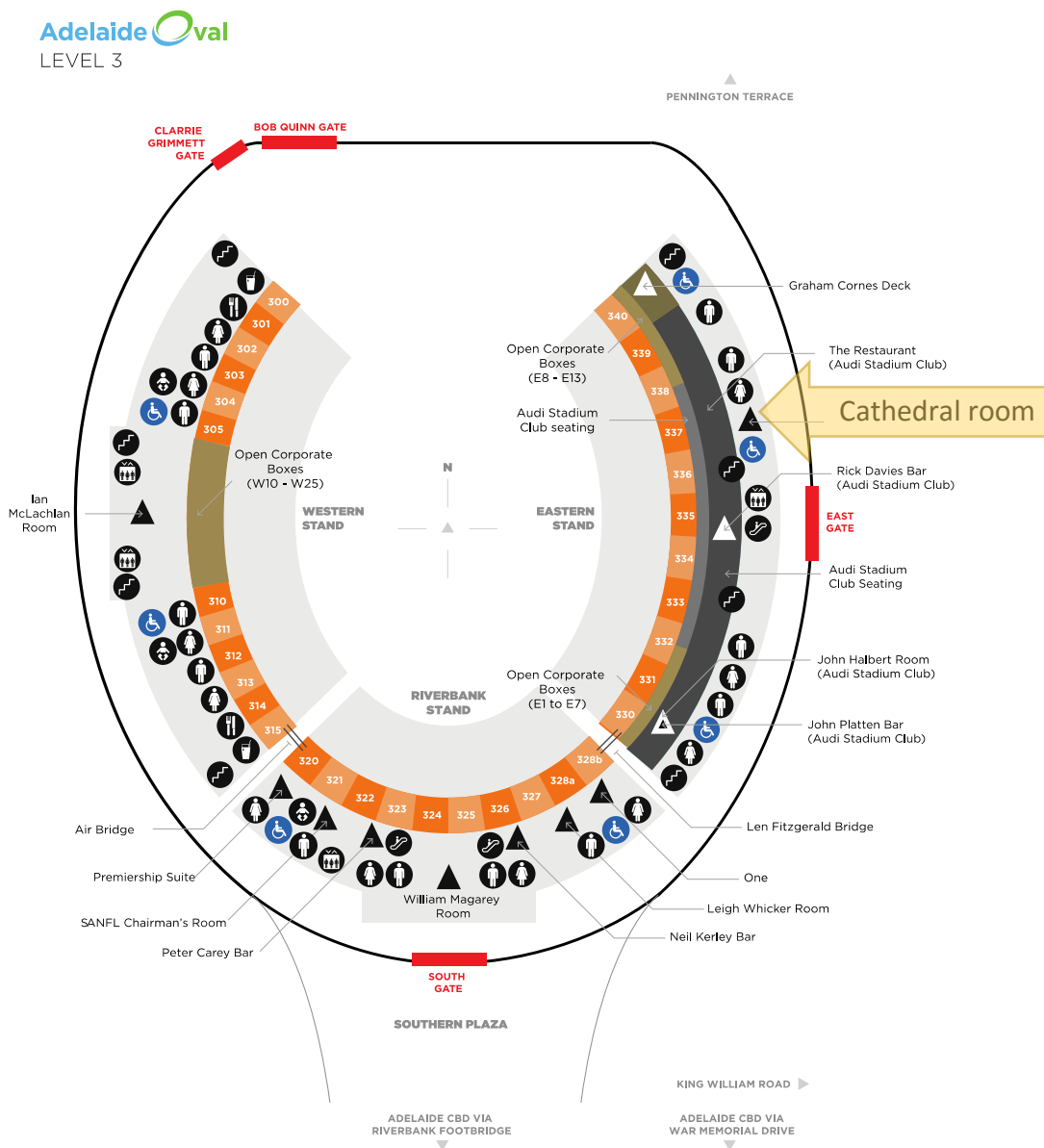
